Dee Valley Medical updates...

We would like to wish all of our patients a Happy New Year and take this opportunity to thank everyone who contributed donations for tea, coffee and cake at our Flu and Covid Clinics, as well as our 'Guess the Bear' competition. The monies raised are being used by our nursing team to purchase much needed new and replacement clinical equipment.

We would also like to thank our patients for their understanding and support through what has been a challenging year for our practice. As the end of the year now approaches, we are pleased to reassure the community that we have benefitted from successful recruitment and internal advancements. Following the departure of Dr Andrew Doyle at the end of March, Dr Rosemary Fallows and Dr Gareth Bowdler have agreed equal share partnership with both doctors now committed to eight sessions per week each, since 1st October 2023. Dr Karen Gait is congratulated on completion of her GP training and we were delighted that she has chosen to join our team as a salaried GP for four sessions per week since mid October. ANP Liz Davison returned in July and Julie Williams qualified as a Registered Nurse in November. Liv Williams has transferred from reception to the Nurse Team to train as an HCA and Lynn Carr was welcomed to the team on 6th November as a full-time receptionist.

Our planned branch surgery relocation to Station Road in Bangor-on-Dee received Betsi Cadwaladr University Health Board authority in July. Unfortunately, a hiatus concerning Highways concerns for traffic exiting the 'established' Station Road car park has delayed confirmation of Planning Permission. Despite challenging the Highways position through our own experts we cannot commit to confirming a move date until the Planning Permission is confirmed. You will appreciate that we are just as frustrated about this as our Bangor-on-Dee patients and community must feel.

The NHS Wales App is now live and NHS Wales is preparing to terminate 'My Health Online' (MHOL), which will be decommissioned on 31st December 2023. Please download the NHS Wales App without delay which will enable you to access patient services such as appointment booking and repeat prescription requests. More facilities, such as

access to your clinical history, should be available in the

near future.

We also had a successful fundraising time so huge thanks to everyone for all your efforts, whether Bags2School or


buying raffle tickets, having a table at our tabletop sale or making cakes...wow you

Not sure what to do with all your leftover food from Christmas? Why not try.... Christmas Leftovers Pizza

Ingredients:

145g pizza base mix 6tbsp tomato pasta sauce

Large handful (about 100g) leftover stuffing

Large handful (about 100g) leftover cooked turkey, shredded.

100g mozzarella, sliced

1tbsp olive oil.

Method:

- 1. Heat the oven to 220c/200c fan/gas 7. Prepare the pizza base mix following pack instructions. Once rolled out, leave to rest for 10 mins, then top with the pasta sauce.
- 2. Scatter over the stuffing and turkey, then top with the mozzarella. Drizzle a little olive oil over the pizza then bake for 10-12 mins until the crust is crisp and the cheese has melted.

Turkey and Pesto Croissants

Ingredients:

6 butter croissants

4tbsp green pesto

300g leftover cooked turkey, shredded or sliced

100g mozzarella or cheddar cheese, shredded

Method:

- 1. Heat the oven to 200c/180c fan. Slice the croissants in half lengthways and spread the pesto on to both sides. Lay your turkey on top of the pesto and then sprinkle with cheese.
- 2. Place the croissants onto a baking tray, open so that the cheese will melt, and bake until the turkey is warm and the cheese is melted.
- 3. Fold the croissant closed and enjoy.

N.B. these can also be made in a panini press or toastie maker, or can be eaten cold.
