Overton children decided to design a London double decker bus filled with plants and numerous craft projects depicting many aspects of the games. Out of all the entrants we are proud to announce that Overton Playcentre received the first prize!! A well deserved win, and a massive acknowledgement of Margaret and the team's excellence in providing environmental education.

Jubilee Tree

Following the felling of a tree along the edge of the Playing Fields last year, Overton Community Council, who has the responsibility of maintaining the trees on the playing fields has replanted. The new tree was donated by Eastwick Nurseries and planted by Ian Atkinson of 'All Things Trees'. The tree is a Liquidambar styraciflua, which will grow to 65–115 ft, and can live for up to 400 years. The rich dark green, glossy leaves generally turn brilliant orange, red, and purple colors in the autumn.

As the tree was planted in the Diamond Jubilee year, the Council commemorated the event by placing a plaque in front. Ian Atkinson unveiled the plaque in the presence of OCC Chairman David Burton, and Cllr David Hughes. The Council have sent their congratulations to Her Majesty, on the occasion of her Jubilee and the reply is on the right

Ramblings From the Reverend **by Rev'd David Child**



Last month I had what best can be described as an interesting experience. I was locked in church! I'd gone there late one afternoon to do some work in the vestry on some church documents. It took longer than I expected but then eventually it was 'job done' and time to go home. But when I got to the main door – it was locked! The person who had locked up had done all the right things; he'd walked around, shouted and checked that there was no one there. But I, in the quiet of the vestry had been quite oblivious to it all.

'No problem' I thought, because I had the key to the main door with me. But it's a dead lock – the key only works from the outside. And whoops, my mobile was in the car and I hadn't told anyone where I was going. I had visions of spending the night there. So what did I do? People asked me if I prayed. Yes, I uttered a prayer and to be honest I uttered more than a prayer. Most people do in those sort of circumstances. It's fortunate that when we don't know what we should pray for or how we should pray that the Bible tells us that God unscrambles our prayers for us. It was then that I remembered an article that I wrote some years ago for our Deanery Church Magazine. And here, from my files, is what I wrote in November 2008:-

The Church Times, the weekly newspaper of the Church of England also includes reports and articles relating to the Church in Wales. The back page as you might suspect is not a 'Sports Page' but rather an interview with some interesting person with a religious bent. Recent people who've been interviewed include musicians, business people, writers, and chairpersons of national institutions. The last question always is, 'Who would you choose to be locked in a church with?' Answers have included Bach, Osama bin Laden, John Newton and Charles Wesley. So what would my reply be? Who would I choose to be locked in a church with? I suppose in all honesty, it would be anyone as long as they had a mobile phone, or saving that – a bell ringer. But to play the game properly, I think my reply would be St Luke, whose feast day was October 18th

I wasn't locked in with anyone but hey! I could ring the bells. I hope people in the village didn't think World War 3 had broken out because I rang frantically. Fortunately people soon came running and I was free.

It's funny how past experiences can help you deal with today's problems. And prayer is a strange thing too. William Temple a former Archbishop of Canterbury said 'When I pray, coincidences happen, and when I don't, they don't.' Scientists who are Christians don't have any problems with this. In quantum terms observing something changes the balance of probability in a particular direction. And prayer is after all the way we learn to think like God. With every blessing,

Firstly a quick thanks to everyone who came to see us during the Village Fete. It was especially nice to see the youths enjoying the police car being there and to have a sit in the driver's seat, trying the lights plus trying on the Police uniform whilst putting the handcuffs on Mum's and Dads.

Over the past month the vast majority of crime in our village has been to outbuildings, sheds & garages, an easy target for criminals as they may contain expensive gardening equipment, bikes etc, and that they're not always locked. Please ensure you lock all outbuildings with a strong secure padlock/chain, don't make it easy for them!

There has also been a burglary in Bangor-on-Dee where an expensive sports car was stolen from the victims drive. The criminal forced entry to the house and took the car keys. If you have a garage please put your car in it, also make sure it's locked and alarmed at all times. With car keys make sure that they're out of sight and placed in a safe location. I always try to advise people to invest in some CCTV cameras and good outside lighting.
