### Covid card

In a statement Vaughan Gething said: "Those receiving a COVID-19 vaccination will be given a credit card-sized NHS Wales immunisation card which will have the vaccine name, date of immunisation and batch number of each of the doses given handwritten on them. "These will act as a reminder for a 2nd dose and for the type of vaccine, and it will also give information about how to report side effects."

## The Covid Vaccination

British media is excitedly reporting the commencement of the Pfizer Covid (SARS-CoV-2) vaccination programme.

Unfortunately, much of the media coverage is about England and many people in Wales can be excused for believing that the Covid vaccine will be available through their GP. This is only happening in England and only through GP surgeries that have signed up to an NHS England Direct Enhanced Service.

**In Wales,** Welsh Government/NHS Wales, have decided not to offer the Covid vaccine through GPs. We understand that in North Wales there will be delivery at three hospital sites and eleven other vaccination centres.

Patients should expect to be contacted directly by NHS Wales and in accordance with their priority determined by age and vulnerability to Covid. Please do not contact Overton Medical Practice with any query concerning the Covid vaccination as our team are not informed and will not be able to assist you.

Meanwhile, we are very pleased to confirm that there has been a strong uptake of our flu vaccination programme and we are grateful to our patients for attending in good time for their appointment and cooperating with a Covid 19 procedures.

After consultation your Community Council has adopted the ownership and future maintenance of the bench.


The bench will be removed shortly for renovation and then will reinstate once it has been restored.

- Please note that grants will normally be capped at £500, however applications above this amount will be considered on an individual basis.

## Register to Vote by Post

Councils throughout Wales are encouraging people who are eligible to vote to register for a postal vote. Anyone can apply to vote by post. You don't need to give a reason.

In 2021 there will be the Welsh Senedd elections on May 4th to elect 60 members to the Welsh Parliament. For many people, a postal vote is the most suitable alternative as it is an easy and convenient way of voting - especially if you don't want to visit a polling station or might struggle to get there on the day. You can apply to vote by post for a single election, for a specific period of time or permanently.

## Christmas With a Difference at St Mary's School

Usually, at St Mary's, December would be a busy time for teachers and pupils, as we come together as a whole school to create a Christmas play to perform in front of proud families and friends at St Mary's Church. We knew that this year would be different due to the rules surrounding COVID but that didn't hold us back and we decided, instead, to film individual and unique Christmas performances in each Year-group 'bubble', so that we could still share the joy of Christmas with our families. Nursery and Reception children opted for a sing-along of some Christmas favourites, whilst Year 1 and 2 got busy painting their own backdrops for a retelling of the Nativity. Whilst the filming of the Nativity had to be postponed, with Year 1 and 2 moving to home learning in the last week of term, this didn't stop the festive fun. The children got together online instead and had a sing-along of the songs they'd been working so hard on in school. It included family favourites such as 'Little Donkey' and 'Away in a Manger' which was then topped off by a Makaton signed version of Louie Armstrong's 'Wonderful World'. Mrs Lawrenson said it was a heart-warming experience seeing the pupils faces as they sang along together on screen. Reuben told us about his experience in Year 2: "We had lots of fun. If you were Helper Heddiw you got to open the Advent calendar. This made me feel happy. My favourite part was doing the play."



Year 3 filmed a Christmas singing extravaganza for parents to watch, with classics 'Away in a Manger', 'This Little Light of Mine' and 'Merry Christmas Everyone' by Shakin' Stevens; there was a lot of dancing in that one!

For their Christmas concert, Year 4 wrote their own Christmas poem and prayer to perform. They also learnt two new songs, 'The Twelve Days of Christmas' and 'Silent Night'. Some fantastic news too that Year 4 pupils, Grace, Riley and Ffion, who entered Bishop Gregory's Christmas Card drawing competition, have all been awarded highly commended certificates for their designs! Well done!



Year 5 filmed a presentation for their parents and families on the subject of 'Christmas around the World'; it uncovered some fascinating and bizarre traditions, such as Sweden's festive obsession with Donald Duck and an Italian Christmas which represents Santa!



Year 6 created an extra special performance this year, departing from the usual Nativity and opting for a recreation of the Christmas Truce of 1914. They used green screen technology to bring to life the war-torn landscape of the trenches of World War 1 and the poignant events of Christmas that year. Year 6 parents were extremely impressed by the fantastic performances which included some impressive accents! The story also brought home the true meaning of Christmas and how it can unite people in even the hardest of times. Tigs told the audience: "It was a hopeful moment of recognition of common humanity... The Christmas truce of 1914 shows us that the Christmas story is so powerful that it can stop war in its tracks - even if only briefly - and that the things that unite us as human beings are stronger than the things which divide us." Pupils were also very grateful to members of St Mary's Church who provided all pupils with the items needed to make their own Christingles – keeping alive this wonderful tradition which reminds us that Jesus is the Light of the World.
