The Blues Band comes to Overton

Following on in the great series of gigs at Overton Village Hall is on Friday December 16th - **The Blues Band** whose members will need no introduction to those people who remember the great popular music of the 60s and 70s. This band has gone on to be at the forefront of British blues music for over 30 years and we are incredibly lucky that they have agreed to play for us in Overton.

The Blues Band was formed in 1978 by Paul Jones, actor, BBC Radio presenter and legendary lead singer of R'n' B and pop group Manfred Mann and Dave Kelly, arguably Britain's finest blues guitarist who had played with blues legends Howlin' Wolf and John Lee Hooker amongst others.



Guitarist Tom McGuinness, whose first band was The Roosters which he formed with Eric Clapton, also joined Manfred Mann. He then formed the successful group McGuinness Flint, with John Mayall drummer Hughie Flint and Benny Gallagher and Graham Lyle. Completing the line-up is the rhythm section of Gary Fletcher on bass guitar and drummer Rob Townsend formerly of rock bands, Family and Medicine Head.

The event will undoubtedly be a sell out and tickets will be available at The Corner Shop and Wason's Garage from October 15th and are priced at £20. There may also be a support act so the timings will be on the tickets and posters.

Ramblings From the Rectory

From the Curate, the Rev'd David Child

On Sunday September 11th we said goodbye to David and Sue. We



held a special joint service at St Mary's together with the congregations of Erbistock and Penley and followed this with a buffet lunch in the village hall. David was presented with gifts from the three parishes - a Kindle from Overton, a Vacuum Cleaner from Penley and a Silver Picture Frame from Erbistock. Sue was presented with a Digital Photo Frame, a bouquet of flowers and perfume. David has been for us a very caring and thoughtful parish priest and he will be remembered for his pastoral care and for the enthusiasm he showed in the school and family services. And I shall miss him as a friend.

Some others were leaving at the same time – swallows! Around Easter time this year three returned to our garden. After some weeks there were seven and then in at the beginning of September over thirty – I think our telephone wires act as sort of swallows departure lounge for the whole of our village but now they've flown. How do they do it – fly all the way down to Africa only to return to exactly the same spot about six months later?


Well, it seems they do have a compass. Swallows like other migrating birds have in the retina at the back of their eyes receptors not only for light but also for the earth's magnetic field. These photo pigments are called cryptochromes. They are able to detect subtle changes in the earth's magnetic field by the way it affects the spin and orbit of the electrons in the atoms of these cryptochrome molecules and in that way the chemistry of their cells.

So it seems that swallows as well as 'seeing' what we see, 'see' also the earth's magnetic field probably as a shifting pattern, such as an array of lights and colours. When they are on the right flight path they 'see' a familiar pattern. If they divert from that path the pattern changes only for it to return to the familiar pattern when they get back on the right track.

Amazing isn't it? The more we learn about our universe the more amazing it seems to be. For me it's like a modern day parable. Because what are we as Christians asked to do? We are asked to fix our eyes on Jesus and follow his teaching, to love God and to love and respect our neighbour, to follow his pattern day by day so that he can guide us through this life to our final destination.
