I don't know whether you're familiar with the Pokémon Go game. It's sweeping the country. It's a game where you collect and trade creatures called Pokémon. It's one of the first popular games to use augmented reality – a kind of cross between real life and the on-line world which brings children and adult fantasies to life. It uses the player's mobile phone GPS to locate where they are and then makes Pokémon virtual creatures to appear on the phone screen in real life locations. Altogether there are 151 virtual creatures to catch (picture shows just one). It's become a viral sensation among teens and young adults who are now outside walking around with their phones rather than being stuck indoors with them.



We were amazed one summer day when Diane's grandchildren visited us that the first thing they wanted to do was to visit St Mary's Church! You see our church like other churches, pubs, buildings of any special interest have all become Pokémon Stop sites. So what does the church think – we think that it's fine, it's harmless it gets people out and about and it gets people talking together. Later in the summer I was sitting down having a chat with Bishop Gregory and some other clergy. We talked about Pokémon. The general consensus was again no problem. We'd be delighted to see young people wandering around our churches with their mobiles. OK - so what if they catch a Pokémon on their mobile; you never know they may find something else there as well. In fact I've come across some quotes on the web - 'This game made me go to church' 'My first Pokémon stop was a church and I thought God was telling me something'.

After we'd discussed Pokémon Bishop Gregory asked us whether we thought there would one day be Human-Machine interfaces, that is – beings that would be both human and machine. We all thought probably 'yes' but we found the concept very worrying. Then one of the clergy piped up

'Well there has been one God-Human interface.'

What an amazing way to think of Jesus and to explain him in this day and age!

Hello everyone,
Just a couple of things to report this month. We have had some concerns raised as regards to parking on the double yellow lines outside the chemist on High Street. Please could you **not do this** and either use the car park next door or the main one at the back. There are plenty of spaces so there is no excuse. Whilst vehicles continue to park here, it causes an obstruction through the village and makes it difficult and dangerous for residents crossing to enter Peel Close and also vehicles overtaking the parked cars that are too near the bend onto Pen y Llan Street. It has been reported to me that there were nearly 2 collisions only the other day practically one after the other. The area will be monitored and if this persists we will take action and parking enforcements will be issued.

Also we've noticed most residents seem to be adhering to the highway code and not parking too near the junction of Turning Street and the High Street. But I did come across a vehicle the other day that seems to have just been dumped actually on the junction. Keeping this area clear makes it much easier and safer for motorists travelling from Bangor Road to approach the junction on the correct side of the road and avoid a possible collision. I appreciate there are lots of cottages in the area where there is no parking available but we must all be responsible and forward thinking as to where we leave our vehicles. So many thanks but we will continue to monitor the area to keep it safe for everyone

There seems to be a spate of car key burglaries in the general Wrexham and surrounding areas lately, where criminals are entering houses, taking the car keys and driving the cars away. Please be mindful of this and where you leave your keys. Ladies, do not leave your handbags downstairs at night with your keys and belongings on show, take them upstairs with you and keep car keys hidden.

Ken Farrell

We are very sad to report the passing of Ken Farrell age 91, who was one of the founding members of the Oracle Editorial Committee. Ken was one of those who supported the idea of a monthly newspaper for Overton and served on the committee from January 1999 until March 2003. He was a regular contributor, especially on local history, right up until recent months; his last article was printed in last month's edition. Some of his most excellent pieces included several articles for the celebrated Stargazer column!



Ken served on Overton Community Council for many years from 1991 including seven years as Vice Chairman and a further year as Chairman, retiring in May 2003. He was a keen walker and a long-time member of the Ramblers Association and was responsible for many years for opening up the 42 public footpaths in the Overton Community Area, many of which had fallen into disuse and had been blocked and diverted. He worked tirelessly with Wrexham Council to re-open all the footpaths and to oversee the replacement of stiles and gates on the pathways around the village which are enjoyed today by us all.

Mike Wason (left in picture) and Ron Whitfield (right) grew up in Overton and both went to Penley School. In 1966 they left Overton for Shrewsbury (Mike in January, Ron in September) and joined the former Shropshire Constabulary as Police Cadets. Aged 19 they both became Constables in the newly formed West Mercia



Constabulary and went their separate ways. Mike served about 7 years and then changed careers. He joined Shropshire Council and had a successful career in Trading Standards. Ron continued in the Police Service and became the Chief Superintendent in charge of the Kidderminster Division. He retired from the Force in 2001.

On 5th September 2016, to celebrate the 50th anniversary of becoming Police Cadets, Mike, Ron and some former colleagues met in Shrewsbury for a reunion. Mike and Ron had not seen each other since 1976. A great time was had by all and a promise was made to make it an annual event.

Gwen Dalby

We were sad to hear that Gwen Dalby had passed away, aged 90. Gwen was brought up at her parents' business "The Newsagents" in Bangor Road, Overton (now a private house). She helped her parents run the shop and there met her future husband Alf when he was delivering to the shop the large, acid-filled batteries for the valve radios of the time, and which Gwen would then deliver around the village and lanes. After the war she and Alf ran the shop and were the village's newsagents until they retired to a bungalow in the village. Many local people will remember their first employment working for them as paper boys and girls.



Gwen was an excellent musician, playing the organ at St Mary's Church and during World War II she was pianist for the Savana Dance Band with Dick Cross, Jan Zamojski, Percy Rogers and Kath Hamlington which played for dances twice a week at the Village Hall. Gwen moved to be near her daughter after Alf's death in 2013 and passed away at Chasey House, Rhos on Sea.
